Municipal Association of SC advocacy staff will discuss legislation that could impact members of the SC Municipal Insurance and Risk Financing Fund and SC Municipal Insurance Trust. Additional topics will include first amendment auditors, sovereign citizens, reducing risk when terminating employees, a workers' compensation commission update and a cybersecurity panel. Meteorologist Tim Miller will also present on changing weather patterns in South Carolina.

Speakers

Bob Bianco, Policy Evaluator, SC Criminal Justice Academy

Bob Bianco is a policy evaluator with the Legal Unit at SCCJA. He attended Eastern Kentucky University majoring in police administration and minoring in business. Bianco began his career as a patrolman for the City of Pewee Valley. He later joined Oldham County Police Department and held the positions of patrolman, detective, SWAT operator and sergeant of detectives. He was selected as the agency's 1994 officer of the year, and selected to attend the 1995 FBI National Academy training in Quantico, Virginia, Session 180. In 1996, he joined the FBI as a special agent. He retired from the FBI while holding the role of applicant coordinator and intern program coordinator in 2022.

Cynthia Dooley, Commission, SC Workers' Compensation Commission

Cynthia C. Dooley graduated magna cum laude with a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of South Carolina in 1978. She worked for Aetna Casualty & Surety as a senior claims representative for 13 years. She then graduated from the University of South Carolina School of Law in 1997 and joined the insurance defense firm of Turner Padget, where she worked for 25 years specializing in workers' compensation defense. She also became a certified mediator in 2007 and was inducted into the National Academy of Distinguished Neutrals in 2022. Dooley was appointed by Gov. Henry McMaster to the SC Workers' Compensation Commission as a Commissioner in 2022. She is the first person to hold the position as a commissioner that has previous experience as a workers' compensation section of the SC Bar from 2021 – 2022. Dooley currently serves on the board of directors for the SC Workers' Compensation Association, Southern Association of Workers' Compensation Administrators and National Association of Workers' Compensation Judiciary.

Casey Fields, Director of Advocacy, Municipal Association of SC

Fields joined the Association in 2006. She oversees the advocacy department. Prior to becoming the director of advocacy, she served as the manager of municipal advocacy and was responsible for the Association's grassroots strategy for legislative issues and was the organization's primary contact with the news media. Before joining the Association, she was the legislative liaison at South Carolina First Steps to School Readiness and advocacy and public awareness coordinator at the SC Campaign to Prevent Teen Pregnancy. Fields is a graduate of the College of Charleston and holds a master's degree from the University of South Carolina in social work and public administration.

Shelley Forney, Motivational Speaker

Shelley Forney is a renowned presenter who shares impactful stories about the dangers of distracted driving. In 2008, her life and the lives of her family were changed forever. This motivated her to become an advocate and speaker for distracted driving awareness. She presents powerful talks, educating audiences about the risks of electronics and other distractions behind the wheel. Through storytelling and statistics, Forney inspires change in driving habits and safety policies. She has advocated for stronger distracted driving laws and provided key testimony to support legislation. Forney's passion for this cause is fueled by her profound personal loss. Though still devastated, she finds purpose in potentially lifesaving outreach. Forney's dedication to awareness makes her an influential voice for distracted driving reform.
